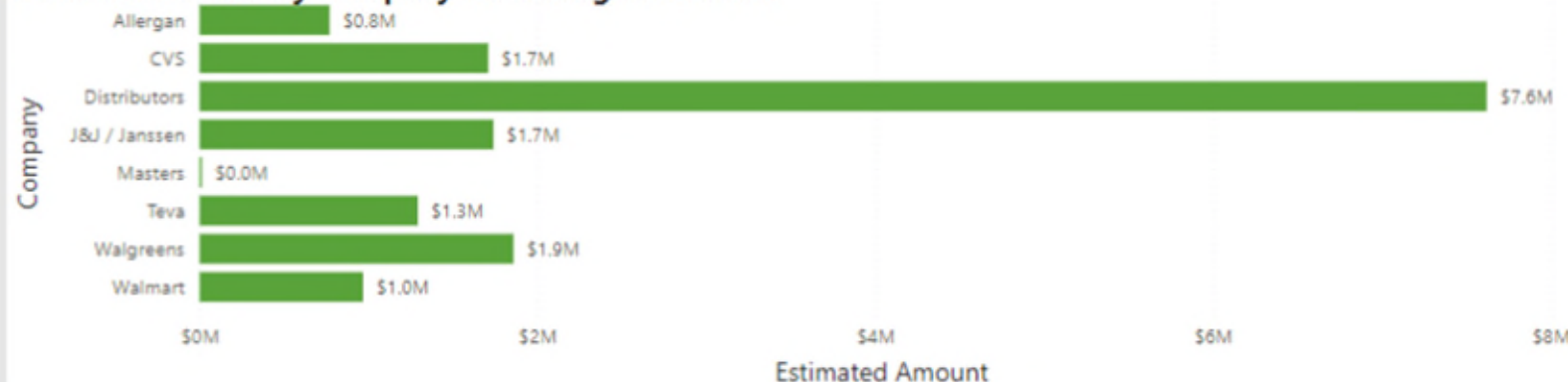
MAC Opioid Settlement: Home Page

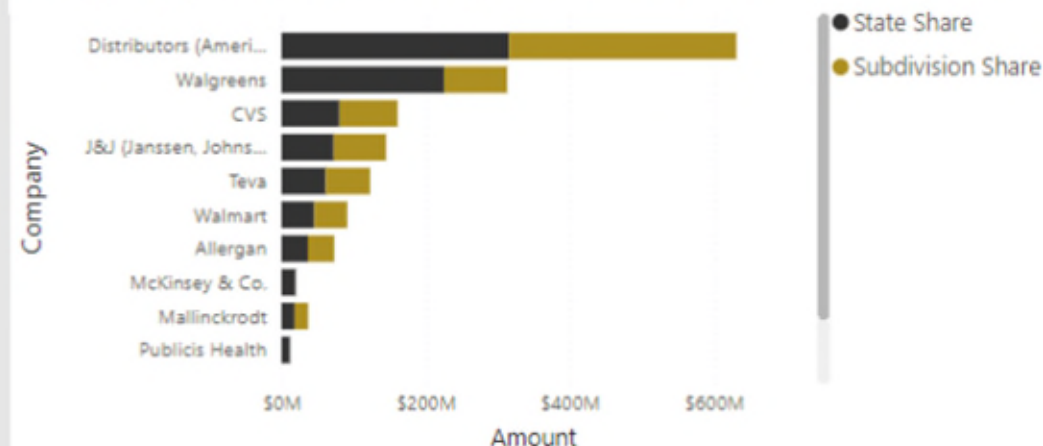

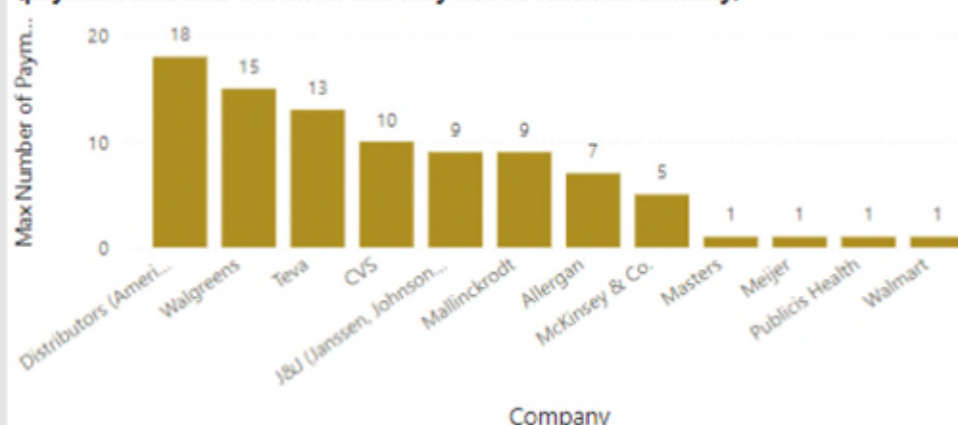
Michigan Opioid Settlements Overview

Summary of Activities to Date

- Established an Opioid Settlement Steering Committee in February 2024 via Resolution 24-036 and subsequently a Data Sub-Committee
- Technical assistance provided by Michigan Association of Counties and Michigan State University; planning support and coordination provided by Health Department
- Review of Exhibit E allowable remediation uses, available data and current services inventory
- Planning needs assessment process to include diverse provider, community and lived experience

Updated Planning Timeline

- Needs Assessment Focus Groups and Interviews (July – October)
 - Substance use disorder, medical, and harm reduction providers
 - Individuals who are incarcerated, justice involved, in recovery and actively using drugs
 - Youth and collegiate community
- Final MSU Needs Assessment Report Completed (December)
- Steering Committee recommendations related to programmatic/service priorities and mechanism for distribution of funds submitted to the Board of Commissioners for consideration (January 2025)
